‘ROAD SAFETY MANAGEMENT’

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Road transport remains the least safe mode of transport, with road accidents representing the main cause of death of people. Every year more than a lakh persons get killed and five lakh injured on roads, often severely.

The boom in the vehicle population without adequate road infrastructure, poor attention to driver training and unsatisfactory regulation has been responsible for increase in the number of accidents. India’s vehicle population is negligible as compared to the World statistics; but the comparable proportion for accidents is substantially large. There have been several attempts by the Government of India to promote road safety.

In the above context, the demands made on the regulators and administrators of road transport have become more and more complex and the future will make them even more varied and challenging. The need for stricter enforcement of law to ensure greater safety on roads and an environment-friendly road transport operation is of paramount importance. Safety and security are growing concerns for businesses, governments and the travelling public around the world, as also in India.

It is, therefore, essential to take new initiatives in raising awareness, skill and knowledge of Transport department personnel who are expected to implement the policies of the government in order to facilitate safe mobility. The target beneficiary for this training programme on ‘Road Safety Management’ would be the officers of Motor Vehicle Department.

2.0 OBJECTIVES

- To discuss Transportation System Management (TSM) techniques for increasing road safety
- To provide insight into road accident investigation and reduce accident risk for the vulnerable road users
- To discuss engineering and legislative aspects for improving road safety
